Quebec Branch receives 2021 National Advocacy Award

This award was presented by the Association's National Office because of our Branch's efforts to communicate the priorities of our Association to our candidates from all political parties. This award also recognizes exemplary efforts to advance the Association's advocacy strategies. As stated by our President René Grenier. "This award is an important demonstration that our members are proud to be part of an association that is committed to the defense of the rights and interests

of pensioners and future pensioners. It is also a recognition of the work of our volunteers who deserve to be noted for so much constant effort to succeed in the activities of a non-profit association like ours."

The 2021 federal election for our Branch - After the 2019 federal election, we had contacted the elected MPs in writing and subsequently met with several virtually. Many incumbent MPs knew us well and know what our concerns are as an Association. So, for the Federal Election 2021, we wanted to introduce ourselves to the new candidates and remind all candidates, in our Branch ridings and in the major political parties, that we are always there to defend the rights and interests of our members and of our future members.

As the pandemic has brought to light the weaknesses of our system in supporting seniors, this time around we have emphasized the importance of a national senior's strategy that focuses on health care, caregiver support, home care and long-term care. In our correspondence, to keep things concrete, we asked them the following question:

How will your party implement a national senior's strategy that focuses on health care infrastructure, caregiver support, home care and long-term care?

This is why, during this short campaign, our President sent a letter to all the candidates of the main political parties in order to make known our Branch and its priorities, and to invite them to share with us how their electoral platform corresponded to our priorities.

Following our correspondence, we received some answers and we managed to hold a videoconference with Joël Lightbound, from the riding of Louis-Hébert. We would have liked to do more videoconferences with a candidate from each of the major parties, but it was not possible. This 36-day blitz - the shortest possible under the Canada Elections Act - took place against the backdrop of a health crisis. An atypical campaign. And the results of the September 20th vote show that the list of MPs remains guite similar to the last one. Nevertheless, it will be with pleasure that we will resume our Branch's correspondence of with each of them.

Old Age Security Increase for 75 and over - Concerns of our members

Many of our members between the ages of 65 and 75 have reacted to the federal government's decision to provide financial assistance to those aged 75 and over.

On this issue, the Association joined with the FADOQ and the Canadian Association of Retired Persons in calling on the federal government to include seniors between 65 and 75 years of age in the increase to the Old Age Security.

As a result, one million seniors have requested the federal government for sustainable and inclusive financial assistance. They want to ensure that there is no discrimination based on age.

Once the Members of Parliament are in place, we will be contacting them to exchange views and to reminding them of their commitments to seniors.

We will also be present during the 2022 provincial election.


