Message from the President

The pandemic revealed the inadequacy of care and services for the elderly. More than 80% of the deaths related to COVID-19 occurred in congregate settings: long-term care facilities, intermediate resources and seniors' residences (The Tribune, 2021-04-12). For this reason, Federal Retirees have been advocating for a national seniors' strategy at the political level. A coherent policy on the social determinants of health so that different orders of government can fulfill their respective responsibilities. We can learn from the best and introduce new ways of doing things in the community and in home care. A shift is clearly needed!

Our branch is mobilizing as we sense that a federal election is coming. To begin with, we had our Annual General Assembly last April via video conference. It was a great success and thank you to everyone who attended. We were able to fill every seat on the Board of Directors with a mix of old and new volunteers accepting new terms. We also have a new past president, Mr. Jean-Marc Demers, and have reappointed all our advisors for another year. We have received a list of MPs to meet with and we are updating our advocacy files. We have opened a Facebook account for the Quebec City Branch and are working on rejuvenating our website. We also have our newsletters and the Sage Magazine that you can continue to read.

Our COVIDExit committee has kept us connected, despite the Public Health measures. We are anxious to get back to breakfasts and social events, to meet colleagues and to do face-to-face recruiting. At least there is golf for the amateurs. We had high hopes that with a high level of vaccination, we could afford a return to some sort of "normalcy" in early summer. But the virulence of new variants that have emerged is jeopardizing current efforts to control the pandemic, including vaccination. There is not enough data yet available regarding the effectiveness of current vaccines against these new mutants. So, nothing less than a global "maximum suppression" strategy is being talked about.

So, our advisors talked to me about introducing "hygge" to all the members of the Board of Directors of the Quebec City Branch, the art of living practiced by the Danes. If you are going to stay cooped up, you might as well fully appreciate the little moments and have a "positive state of mind".





The Nordicity and the Winterness should be for us also a source of inspiration to better adapt to this pandemic which persists. Try the practice, if you haven't already, you might be surprised. In the meantime, check our website and Facebook from time to time because as soon as we can, we will "reopen the machine" of activities.





Phoenix - Compensation for retirees

During our Annual General Meeting on April 9th, a question was raised by our members concerning the Phoenix compensation for retirees who retired in 2016 or after and who sustained losses caused by delays related to Phoenix. Examples of these losses: Delay in the payment of severance pay, vacation leave and loss of interest related to these delays.

What happened to you? What form do you need to fill out to get compensation? Here it is, we offer you an official response.

NAFR has obtained the following information: "The process has not yet been put in place for retirees. Treasury Board says it may take a few more months before the required form is available."

As soon as the form is available, NAFR will advertise it in SAGE magazine, by email, on our social media and in the Branch Newsletter.

Description

Health in the driver's Seat Conference aims to:

- Inform participants about the various aspects of safe driving of a vehicle and the required health examinations by the SAAQ;
- Review particular driving techniques and specific Statutes;
- Answer specific concerns of seniors and family caregivers.

The main themes are:

- Role of the SAAQ in assessing Seniors' ability to drive;
- Refreshing knowledge on driving (rules of the road, maneuvers, roundabouts, etc.);
- New developments in the Highway Safety Code;
- Sharing the road with vulnerable users (pedestrians and cyclists).
