A Word from the President



Hello to all members,

It's always a pleasure to meet our members, this year in Chicoutimi and Matane. Our friend Ghislain Lavoie was reappointed for another term in the Saguenay region as administrator and liaison officer. On the executive front, we held a brainstorming day on June 7. We had to take stock of what we'd heard at our meetings, consult each other and, as far as our Branch is concerned, draw up an intermediate strategic plan, if such a thing exists: aligned with the Association and with our members.

Just the change of insurance showed us that while for many, the conversion went well, for others it wasn't obvious. This has created palpable pressures for us at branch level. We'll also need to recruit volunteers, but first of all, we need to organize ourselves to welcome them and make them feel productive.

I've just come back from the AMM in Gatineau, where, except for the first few words of welcome, everything was in English. Fortunately, we had translation with headphones. What I learned was that, as an association that defends the interests of our members, despite our outstanding reputation with the federal government, we still have a long way to go. We need to make an enthusiastic commitment to providing an equitable. diverse and inclusive environment for all our members. We may need to rethink the work of the branches, and at the national level, we may need to be more present on the public stage.

Our messages will have to be adapted to the new platforms, i.e., social media, if we want to be heard. If a message is worth a thousand words, now we say a video is worth a million, and stop scrolling to other articles. To grab attention and stay relevant in the eyes of the public, we need to "keep it simple" and publish fewer overly technical articles, be optimistic while keeping a fundamental message, as in TED talks. We remember stories, even if we forget the details. In a word, we have to go out and meet our audience.





Finally, congratulations to Jean-Marc Demers, who received one of the 60th Anniversary prizes awarded by the District of Quebec at the Théâtre du Casino de Gatineau, and to Guy Abel, who won the Best Sixties Costume award by acclamation Abel from the audience at the Annual Dinner. Reminder: Relief Provision for Retired Members

If you joined the PSHCP as a retired member, you may be eligible for the plan's relief provision.

The relief provision has been expanded to include members who retired between April 1, 2015, and March 31, 2025.

For example, if a member retires by March 31, 2025, he may be eligible for a reduced contribution rate based on the 25:75 cost-sharing ratio (participant: employer), provided he meets the following criteria:

- He/She receives the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) guarantee.
- He/She has a net income or combined net income below the GIS eligibility threshold.

Important Report on Home Care and Services

The Health and Welfare Commissioner (HWCC), Ms. Joanne Castonguay, in her mandate on home care and support services, reaches conclusions that are already widely known, in her first two of four reports on the current state of home care and support services.



The summary of the first report is available on the Health and Welfare Commissioner's website. The full report is also available for consultation on the web site of <u>site Web du Commissaire à la santé et au bien-être</u>. The <u>full report</u> is also available for consultation.

The second CSBE report presents a quantified analysis of the performance of home support services, while the third will summarize the overall evaluation of the CSBE. The fourth report will present Ms. Castonguay's recommendations and will be tabled with the

Government in December 2023.

Seniors and Consumer Affairs: Rights to Assert - A Guide for Seniors

QUEBEC CITY, Jan. 26, 2023 /CNW Telbec/ - Consumption is a vast field and the key to avoiding many problems is to get informed! It is with this in mind that the Office de la protection du consommateur offers seniors and their families, as well as the community interveners, various tools to inform them of their rights and remedies regarding the consumption of goods and services.

A free guide to making the right decisions and avoiding problem.

The <u>Seniors and Consumption</u>: Guide - Rights to Assert aims to inform seniors of their rights and help them prevent problems they may encounter in various areas of consumption that particularly affect them.

For example, you will find information on pricing errors at checkout; itinerant sales; legal guarantees; telecommunications services; courses; cards and lines of credit; «miracle» products available on the Internet; the purchase of a trip; the purchase of furniture by invitation and funeral and burial services.

This guide can be downloaded electronically free of charge from the Agency's website so that it can be easily referred to whenever a situation arises. Senior workers are also invited to order copies of this tool to distribute to their clients.

QUÉBEC CITY, Jan. 17, 2023 /CNW Telbec/ - In conjunction with the publication today of the percentages applicable to the calculation of rent adjustments in 2023 by the Administrative Housing Tribunal (TAL), the Minister responsible for Housing reminds us that low-income households can obtain up to \$170 per month to pay their rent thanks to the Housing Allowance (PAL) program of the Société d'habitation du Québec.
