A Word from the President



Hello to all our members.

Spring is the festival of meetings and this time in person. We had our Annual General Meeting (AGM) at the Patro Roc-Amadour on April 8th. Despite the gloomy weather and snow, almost everyone who had registered attended. The National President, Jean-Guy Soulière, came in person to bid us farewell as he will be finishing his mandate in June. Thanks to all the volunteers who made this meeting a success. Following discussions at the AGM about the Quebec Branch's presence in the public sphere, we published an insert "Accueillons les réfugiés ukrainiens" in the Journal de Québec of Friday, May 6 and in Le Soleil of Saturday, May 7, 2022, encouraging Canada to spare no effort in providing humanitarian aid to Ukrainians.

The Outaouais Branch hosted the District of Quebec meeting in Gatineau on May 4 and 5. Micheline Lefrançois and Diane Legros accompanied me to this meeting, which included the presidents and representatives of the other five Quebec Branches, the National President and the General Manager and the two Quebec District Directors. Participants discussed governance, the election of a new national president and had a video conference with the three candidates, Branches funding, membership recruitment and retention, the action plan for the upcoming Quebec elections and help for the translation of our newsletters for our English-speaking members in Quebec.

The President encourages you to post this notice on all your networks.







Last Farewell to Yves Bouchard


