Home and CHLSD care and services

In previous editions of the newsletter, I have dealt with the following claims extracted from the document "FOR A QUÉBEC WORTHY OF ITS SENIORS"

- The death benefit issued by Retraite Québec
- Retirement income
- Of lodging
- The caregivers.



Another aspect dealt with in this guide is home care and services in CHSLDs.

For seniors to be able to age at home and in safety, at some point they will need additional services and home care, which can be accessed through the CHSLD public network or through the private network.

The claims tabled before the provincial election last October dealt with:

- "The creation of a sheltered home care fund to ensure that the money is allocated to each person and the funding translates into patient services."

- "Standardization of Eligibility Criteria for Seniors Independence Program ..."

- "Free parking for visitors in all CHSLDs, to break the isolation of residents. "

From the 2019 provincial budget, the current government has demonstrated that seniors represent an important contribution to society through their involvement in volunteering of all kinds.

One of the concrete measures announced is the creation of 30 seniors' homes for 2022/2023. Another measure is the addition of 900 beds divided up across the various CHSLDs in the province, in order to meet the acute housing needs for seniors.

The appointment of a minister responsible for seniors and caregivers in the person of [Marguerite Blais](#) demonstrates the importance of expectations on the part of the Prime Minister.

See you in four years (2022) to find out if these measures have been carried out.

Chronicle on genealogy

The research tools (continuation and end).

In the last issue, I told you that today we will explore Ancestry and Geneanet search tools.

[Ancestry](#) as well as [Family Search](#) can be searched for in two ways either by completing a search form or by going directly to a particular database such as the [Quebec Parish and Vital Statistics Records](#) (Drouin Collection), 1621 to 1968. In the search page, on the right of the form, you will have the recently viewed collections and you click on one of them if you know exactly what you are looking for and where you are looking for it. In the case of parish registers, it will be necessary to provide the name of the place such as Gaspé or Drummondville and also the name of the parish especially if it is in a city where there are many parishes such as Quebec and Montreal. If you search on Ancestry it is recommended to take at least the annual subscription in its worldwide version, at the cost of approximately \$ 300. Why? Because our ancestors were on the move and they crossed the ocean from France or Ireland among others, and they also often went to earn their living in the United States, so to follow them you do not have to simply be limited to Canada.

As for [Geneanet](#), it is a French web site and it is based mainly on genealogies that is provided by its members. You will have two possibilities:

- 1) Explore it for free, but then you will not have access to the deeds or other documents provided by the members, but this will give you some exploratory hints, because you will get dates and places and if you know how to use them in departmental archives online then you can go yourself and get the documents.
- 2) Take an annual subscription that will give you access to everything but at a cost of \$ 67 CA per year.

On the other hand, Geneanet is more European and will not offer you the necessarily access to databases such as parish registers in Quebec or civil acts in the United States. In terms of research on Geneanet, it's quite simple, you go under the tab "Search" and you fill the boxes that are accessible to you, in other words, those that do not have an orange **P**, for Premium (subscriber), and if you have the Premium subscriber's plan then in this case you can also fill these boxes.

I wish you a good search. I have not received any requests for help that could have been the subject of a more sustained chronicle so while waiting for one or such request (s) I will take a break and wish to read you.


