Grieving: An act of civism and sharing with the community

Today's society is more connected than ever before; ironically, however, we are all much more isolated and alone. Oftentimes, grieving the loss of a loved one is considered a person's own responsibility and an obligation for family and friends. As a result, there has been an increasing trend for "fast-food" funerals and cremations; people want to get over their grief quickly to avoid suffering and despair. Unfortunately, this means the end of getting together, among family, friends, colleagues and other acquaintances, to bereave, see the body of someone who has passed one last time, and celebrate a life well lived.

Grieving is not just a private matter. It is not selfish either. Rather, it is a period that marks the life of any citizen—because we are all part of a community. When we are alive, we share experiences, including joy and sadness, with people around us. We celebrate births, weddings, proms, the Holidays, Easter, Halloween and a variety of other important milestones. This need for sharing has steadily increased thanks to the Internet and social media, such as Facebook and Twitter.

Why wouldn't anyone want to say farewell to someone who was loved and cherished throughout his or her entire life? People are not just part of their families; they are part of the communities they live in. Funeral rites are part of life—just like births and weddings. Grieving is a rite of passage and a civil ceremony that pays homage to life and death.
